While all six drivers are important in shaping the landscape in which each skill emerges, the color-coding and placement here indicate which drivers have particular relevance to the development of each of the skills.

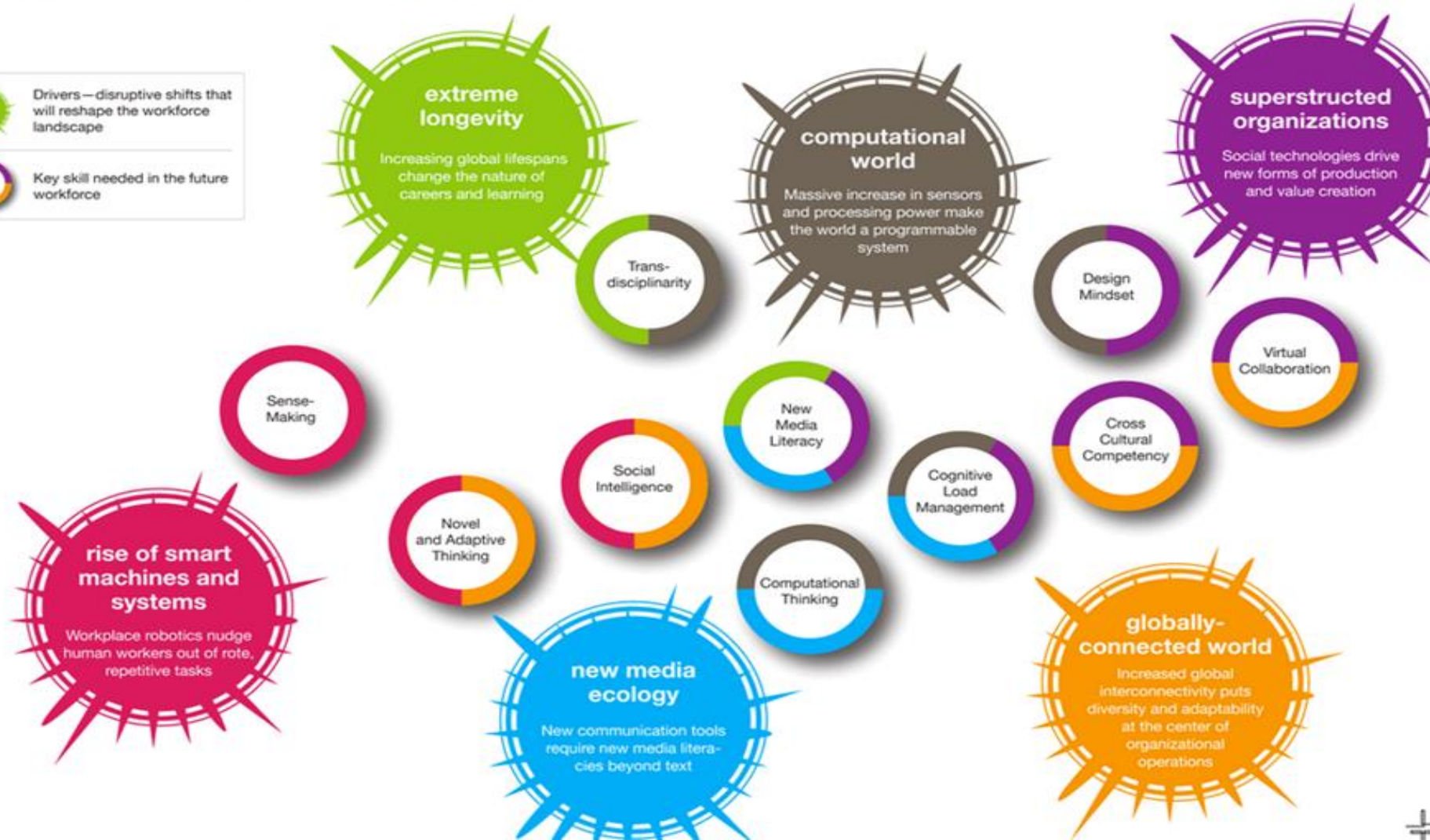

THE FOUR DIMENSIONS FOR FUTURE LIBRARIES

- ▶ 1. This virtual library. Finding media links, obtaining answers to questions, participating in meetings via the library's Web from anywhere in the Internet.
- ▶ 2. Community centered library. Focused on collaborative learning provides meeting spaces convening groups to work on community projects. It, too, may offer advanced technologies available in both physical and digital format.
- ▶ 3. Creation library. A facility that conveys , information, knowledge, art, and entertainment using the library's specialized equipment and facilities.
- ▶ 4. Digital archive library. A place for access to a vast range of media resources, all owned and hosted by other organizations. This library have a physical facility with network access and librarians who may assist the user to find the appropriate resources
